### Change Login Shell on Barnyard machine:

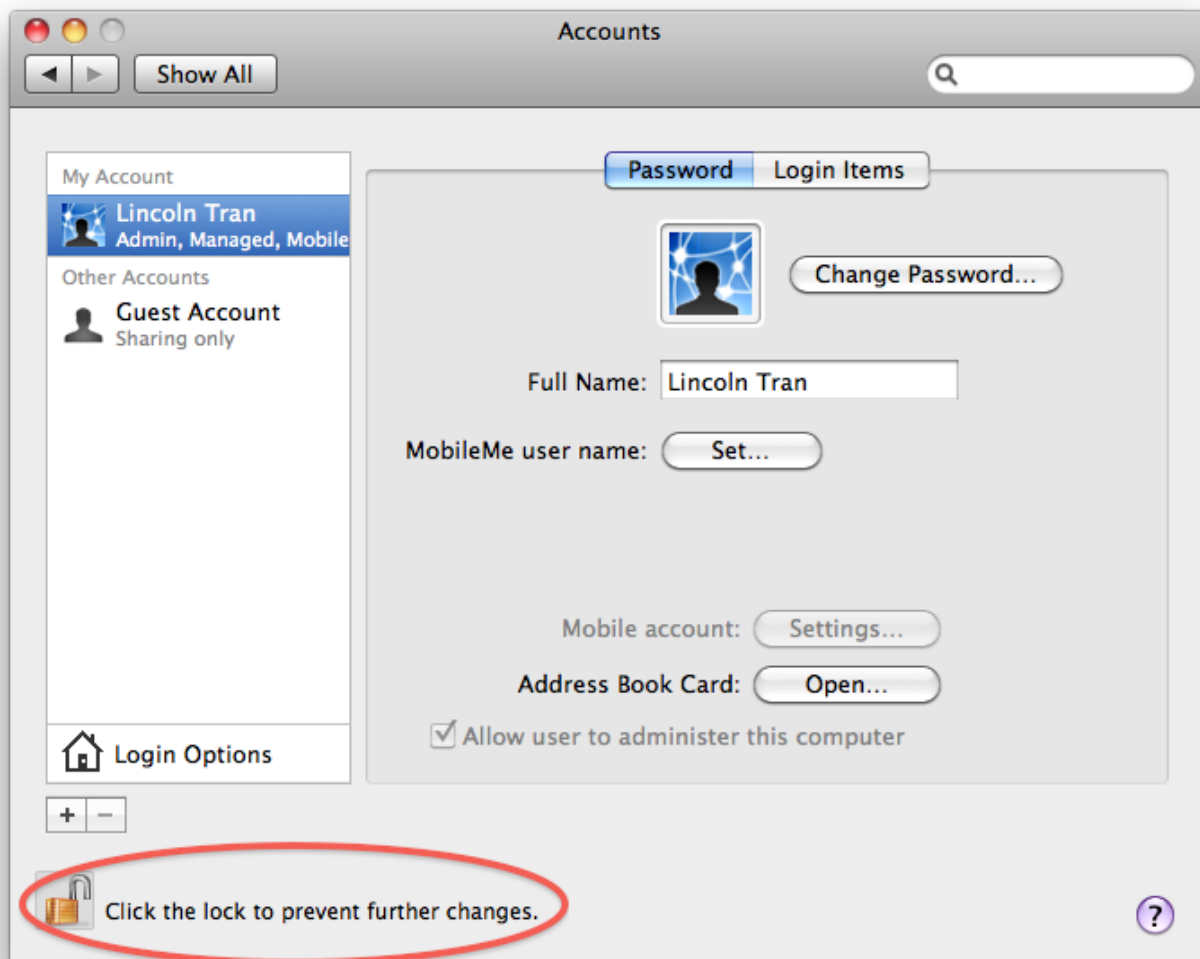

- Open /Applications/Utilities/Terminal.app and type in "echo \$SHELL". This would display the shell you requested.

### If not follow these steps:

- Open System Preferences and click on Users & Groups
- Unlock the lock in the lower left window:



- Right-Click your username (Ctrl-Click for 1-button mouse) and select "Advanced Options"

- Edit your account's login shell to `/bin/tcsh`.
