

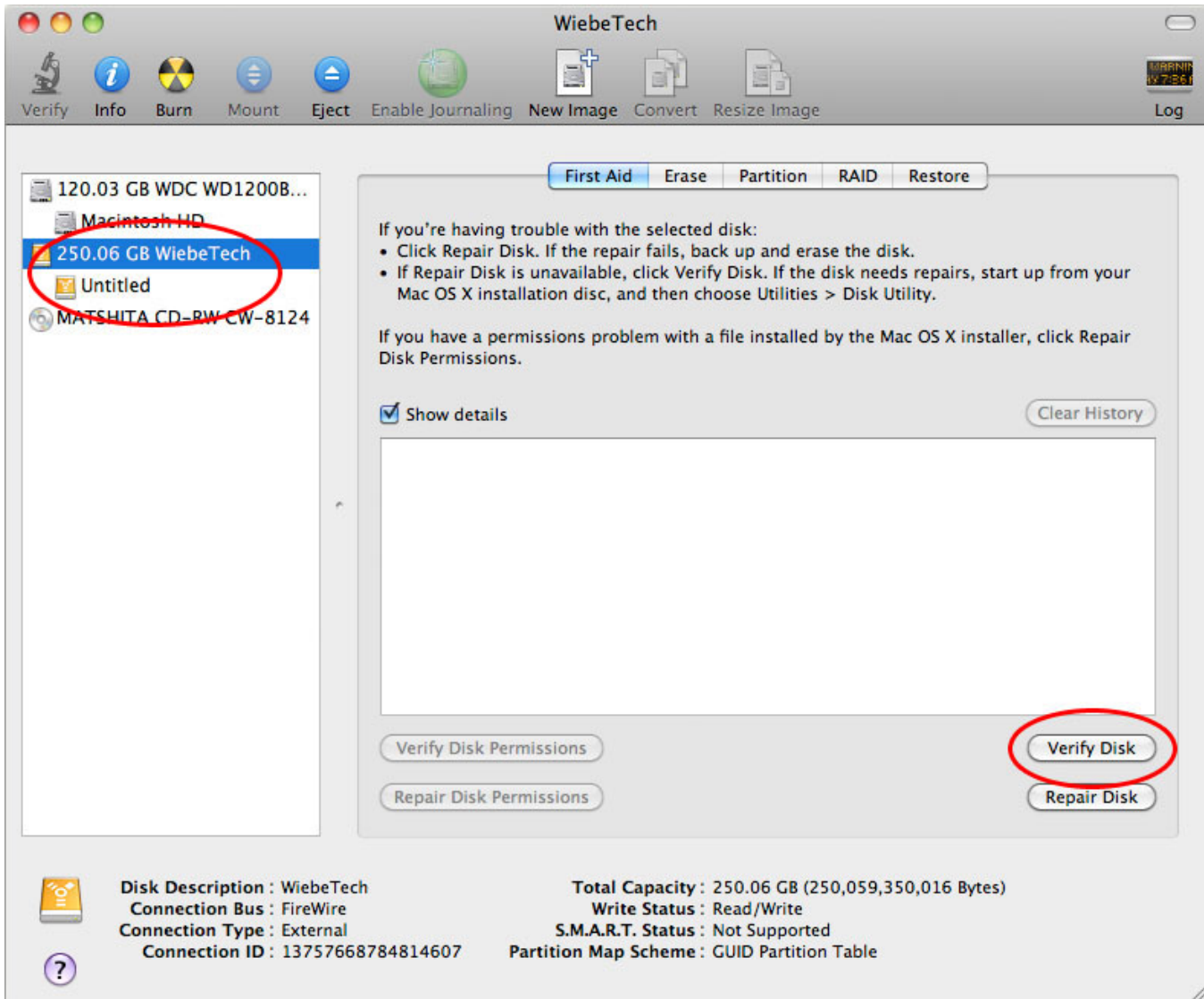
Verify Disk

Use the installed Disk Utility to verify a non-start up disk only.

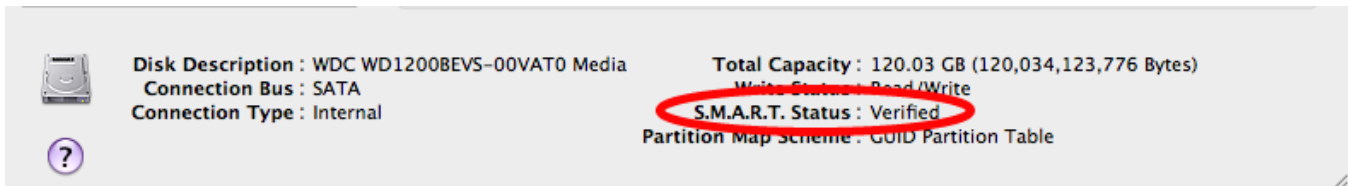
1. Open Applications > Utilities > **Disk Utility**.
2. Choose the volume that you want to verify.
3. Go to **First Aid** tab.
4. Choose **Verify Disk**.



S.M.A.R.T. Status

Mac Hard Drives come with **S.M.A.R.T. (Self-Monitoring, Analysis and Reporting Technology) Status**, which lets the user know if the hard drive is going to fail. Most of the time, it should say **Verified** but if it says **Failing**, please back up your data and replace your hard drive.

To see your **S.M.A.R.T. Status**, go to Disk Utility and select the drive. The status is at the bottom of the window.
